THE ACADIA PARISH POLICE JURY conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, September 13, 2022 at 6:00 PM before the regular Police Jury meeting, 3<sup>rd</sup> floor, Courthouse Building, Crowley, Louisiana, to hear comments on the following item:

1. Implementing the most current Codes along with any amendments as adopted by the State of Louisiana

No public comments given.

THE ACADIA PARISH POLICE JURY met on the above date at 6:00 p.m., in the Police Jury Meeting Room, Courthouse Building, Crowley, Louisiana, in regular session with President, Chance Henry presiding. At the request of the President, a prayer was offered and the Pledge to the Flag was recited in unison. The roll was called and final attendance was recorded as follows:

A motion was offered by Mr. Pat Daigle, seconded by Mr. A.J. Credeur, and carried unanimously, to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the August 9, 2022 Regular Meeting, as written.

A motion was offered by Mr. Gordon Morgan, seconded by Mr. A.J. Credeur and carried to approve the following amendments to the agenda:

- A. Attorney Glen Howie to speak on Mobile Home Subdivision.

  Mr. Glen Howie spoke on the different ordinances where mobile homes, trailer parks and subdivisions are included. Spoke on amending the ordinances to tighten up on the restrictions. A motion was offered by Gordon Morgan and second by A.J. Credeur to add this item to the agenda. Item number Ten.
- B. A motion was offered by Gordon Morgan and seconded by Steve Comeaux to combine agenda number Eight and Thirteen as these are one in the same.

Mr. Jay Domingue with Reach4 Communications spoke to the jurors regarding Broadband in Acadia Parish. They were informed on the projects set for the Mire, Maxi, Egan, Morse and Evangeline areas. Mr. Jay Domingue spoke on the funding of projects in place and projects being proposed to be built. Reach 4 Communication is asking for help with funding to complete these projects. A motion was offered by A.J. Credeur, seconded by Pat Daigle and carried with no opposition.

Mr. James J. Petitjean, Tax Assessor, spoke to the jurors regarding the border review and assessment for this year. A motion was offered and carried by Mr. Steve Comeaux, seconded by Mr. Walter Andrus to adopt the figure, \$373,712,570, as a certified amount for Acadia Parish which does not include the public utilities.

Mr. Brett Bayard with Mader Engineering, Mrs. Megan Duhon with the Chamber and Phillip Sherman with Adams & Reese, LPP Attorneys at Law spoke with the jurors and explained TIF (Economic Development) districts and proposed moving forward with discussion and action on the Economic Development. A motion was offered and carried by Steve Comeaux and Gordon Morgan to engage Adams & Reese, LPP as attorneys for the proposed TIF districts.

Mrs. Ashley Leblanc with Emergency Management (OSHEP) and attorney Glen Howie spoke with the jurors on the new Expedited Temporary Housing Program. Whereas in the event a disaster declaration that includes Acadia Parish, Louisiana homeowners will get help faster with temporary housing. A motion was offered by Mr. Steve Comeaux, seconded by Mr. Jeffery Morgan and carried to have a special meeting at the end of the month and will be discussed with possible actions.

Mr. Glen Howie spoke on the different ordinances and regulations where mobile homes, trailer parks and subdivisions are included. Mr. Glen addressed the ordinances already in place and on the lack of restrictions. He addressed the jury and proposed a new ordinance with specific guidelines with further discussion. A discussion was held and will be moved to the next committee meeting which has been moved to October 6, 2022.

A motion was offered and carried by Mr. Steve Comeaux, seconded by Mr. Gordon Morgan and carried to adopt an Ordinance to rescind a portion of Ordinance 1009 and amend and reenact said portion of that ordinance regulating the building codes of the Parish of Acadia, Louisiana, to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances contrary thereto or in conflict therewith; and to provide for all matters relative thereto.

A motion was offered and carried by Jimmie Pellerin and seconded by Pat Daigle to adopt a resolution granting exceptions to the current Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development design standards for the construction of the Off-System Bridge on Nation Road Bridge over Duralde Coulee, State Project H.014220.

A motion was offered and carried by A.J. Credeur, seconded by Pat Daigle to adopt a resolution to designate, Chance K. Henry, President, to act on behalf of the Acadia Parish Police Jury, in all matters pertaining to the improvements to the Acadia Parish Courthouse building project, including certifying requests for state disbursements.

A motion was offered and carried by A.J. Credeur, seconded by Pat Daigle to adopt a resolution stating approval of a Louisiana Community Development Block Grant Program for fiscal year 2022.

A motion was offered and carried by Steve Comeaux, seconded by Gordon Morgan to change the Acadia Parish Police Jury meeting regular scheduled meeting date from November 8, 2022 to November 7, 2022.

The Monthly Permit office report was reviewed.

The presentation of the monthly financials, which included budget to actual comparison on the general fund and all major funds was given by the CFO.
