WHEREAS, said hearing was held on July 8, 2025, at 6:00 P.M. after notice of said public hearing was published in the official journal of the Acadia Parish Police Jury; and

WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury is authorized by La. Rev. Stat. § 33:4711 to declare immovable property it owns to be “surplus” and no longer serving a public purpose, and is additionally authorized to value and sell such property; and

WHEREAS, the subject lots have been appraised by a licensed appraiser, Zachary T. Miller, and have been found by him to have a market value of \$6,000.00 per lot as of May 27, 2025; and

1. The Acadia Parish Police Jury owns the following described immovable property and obtained full ownership of the same via a *dation en paiement* by RM Enterprises under Act No. 701715 filed for record on July 17, 2002, at COB Z-58, Page 793, in the records of the Acadia Parish Clerk of Court:
