

The Legislative Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, January 6, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Alton Stevenson, Chairperson, Mr. A. J. Broussard, and Mr. A.J. Credeur.

Discussion was held regarding the housing of livestock at large that is picked up by the Acadia Parish Sheriff's Posse.

Mr. Larry Regan stated that he felt a pen located at the Acadia Rice Arena would be ideal for the housing of the livestock.

Juror A. J. Credeur stated that if animals picked up are housed at the Acadia Rice Arena and have to be quarantined for any diseases then it would cause issues for the Acadia Rice Arena. He is also suggested housing them on property behind the Acadia Parish Sheriff's Office.

Mr. Greg Richard, Acadia Sheriff's Posse, asked why we could not house the animals at the animal control facility.

Mr. Tim Benoit, Animal Control Supervisor, stated that it would take more than just a pen to house these horses.

Mr. Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, was instructed to meet with Chief Deputy Keith Latiola regarding the issue of where to house these animals.

Juror A. J. Broussard stated that he had concerns regarding fire ratings for citizens living in Iota Fire Protection District due to the distance from the fire station. He suggested changing the Fire Protection District boundaries.

Mr. Chad Monceaux, Fire Chief of Fire Protection District #11, stated there were more options than changing the boundaries. He stated that Fire Protection District #11 could have a automatic aid agreement with the Iota Fire Protection District to service the areas that are more than seven miles from the Iota Fire Station.

Juror A. J. Credeur suggested that the bonding attorney be contacted regarding boundaries of the Fire Protection Districts.
