

The Airport Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, October 7, 2014, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mrs. Julie Borill, Chairperson, Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, and Mr. Dale Trahan.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury adopt a resolution for LeGros Airport Capital Improvement Program.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to combine agenda items 2 and 3.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury approve Plan Change #1 for the Clean and Reseal Pavement Joints Project at LeGros Memorial Airport and accept low bid of Pavement Maintenance Unlimited LLC for the Clean and Reseal Pavement Joints, Phase II Taxiways Project at LeGros Memorial Airport in the amount of \$181,921.23.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, seconded by Mr. Dale Trahan and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury provide additional funding needed to complete new hangars and renovations to the Mosquito Control warehouse at LeGros Memorial Airport.

The Building and Grounds Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Airport Committee on Tuesday, October 7, 2014, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Robert Guidry, Chairperson, Mr. Alton Stevenson and Mr. A. J. Broussard.

Discussion was held regarding the warm up arena at the Acadia Rice Arena.

Mr. Jeff Bouillion, Chairman of the Acadia Rice Arena Committee, addressed the Committee and stated that he had received quotes to construct the dirt pad for the warm up arena and had accepted the low quote as instructed by the Acadia Parish Police Jury and was ready to move forward with this project. He further stated that he was instructed by the Secretary-Treasurer not to proceed because sealed bids had not been received for this project.

Mr. Richard Latiolais, Secretary-Treasurer, stated that he had instructed them not to proceed because the total cost of the warm up arena would exceed the Public Bid Law's allowance to receive quotes only and that a request for bids must be advertised in the official journal and sealed bids must be received, reviewed, and accepted for this project.

A motion was offered by Mr. Alton Stevenson, seconded by Mr. A. J. Broussard and carried, to instruct the Parish Attorney to research this matter and refer this item to Regular Police Jury Meeting

The Legislative Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Building and Grounds Committee on Tuesday, October 7, 2014, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Alton Stevenson, Chairperson, Mr. A. J. Broussard, and Mr. A.J. Credeur.

The following public comment was received:

Mr. David Reed addressed the Committee and stated that there had been an increase in bicycling in Acadia Parish. He presented a proposed route for bicyclists in Acadia Parish and requested that the Acadia Parish Police Jury accept the proposed route and provide signage along route.

A motion was offered by Mr. Alton Stevenson, seconded by Mr. A. J. Broussard and carried, to add an item to the agenda to authorize the calling of a public hearing to adopt an ordinance accepting the proposed bicycle route and the provision for signage along this route.

A motion was offered by Mr. A. J. Credeur, seconded by Mr. Alton Stevenson and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the calling of a public hearing to adopt an ordinance accepting the proposed bicycle route and the provision for signage along this route.

Discussion was held regarding the transfer of all control of Administrative and Financial matters of the Acadia Rice Arena to the Acadia Rice Arena Committee.

A motion was offered by Mr. A. J. Credeur, seconded by Mr. Alton Stevenson and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct the Parish Attorney to research this matter.

Mr. Paul DeRousselle addressed the Committee and stated that he would like to appeal the foundation inspection of Mr. Ron Lawson and hire another certified plan reviewer and inspector for his business being constructed at 8334 Church Point Hwy. Church Point, Louisiana. He further stated that according to the International Building Code his foundation was in compliance for the type of structure that it was and that Mr. Lawson should not have failed his inspection.

Mr. Ron Lawson stated that he failed the inspection based upon reinforcement beams not being correct size, not being placed correctly, and that the reinforcement was not continuous around the foundation. He further stated that the construction of the building and foundation were inferior and did not meet the standards of the Residential Building Code.

Mr. Paul DeRousselle stated that the type of building he is constructing has to follow only the International Building Codes and not the Residential Building Codes.

Mr. Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, stated that it was Mr. DeRouselle's right to terminate Mr. Ron Lawson as his building inspector and hire another certified plan reviewer and inspector.

A motion was offered by Mr. A. J. Credeur, seconded by Mr. Alton Stevenson and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the calling of a public hearing to adopt an ordinance creating the Acadiana Planning Commission, Inc.
