

The Airport Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 5:30 P.M. on Wednesday, November 2, 2016, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Chuck Broussard, Mr. Kerry Kilgore and Mr. Danny Hebert.

Juror Chuck Broussard explained the following proposed lease terms for vacant property at LeGros Memorial Airport:

If an individual or business would like to build a hangar for aviation use the Police Jury will lease the property to them at \$0.10 per square foot per year. Any individual or business who builds a hangar will have to provide proof of the cost of the building. Any hangar 50' x 50' or larger will receive one year without rent for every \$5,000.00 spent on hangar for a maximum of 20 years. Any hangar 49' x 49' or smaller will receive one year without rent for every \$2,500.00 spent on hangar for a maximum of 20 years. Any new hangars and corresponding storage facilities built will require their own water meter and utility pole.

Mr. Gene LeJeune, resident of Crowley, LA, questioned where the 20 years fit in? He also questioned if airport land could also be used for other businesses?

Mrs. Peggy Romero stated that certain property could be designated for non-aviation use and there were certain guidelines by the Federal Aviation Administration that would have to be followed.

Mr. Bill Nevitt, resident of Crowley, LA, stated that aviation should be defined in the lease agreement.

A motion was offered by Mr. Kerry Kilgore, seconded by Mr. Danny Hebert and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury implement the following lease terms for vacant property at LeGros Memorial Airport: If an individual or business would like to build a hangar for aviation use the Police Jury will lease the property to them at \$0.10 per square foot per year. Any individual or business who builds a hangar will have to provide proof of the cost of the building. Any hangar 50' x 50' or larger will receive one year without rent for every \$5,000.00 spent on hangar for a maximum of 20 years. Any hangar 49' x 49' or smaller will receive one year without rent for every \$2,500.00 spent on hangar for a maximum of 20 years.
