Mr. Richard Latiolais, Secretary-Treasurer, presented two hangar lease proposals to the Committee for their review. He also stated that the new hangars would have one meter and the utilities would be assessed into the rental amount for each hangar.

Mr. Gene Lejeune, current airport hangar lessee, stated that he felt the proposed rental amount of \$250.00/month, utilities included, was too high for the size of the hangar.

Juror Dale Trahan questioned why Mr. Lejeune would not be leasing the hangar that Landry Aero would be vacating instead of one of the new hangars.

Mr. Gene Lejeune stated that he did not pursue the leasing of the larger hangar because there was a business looking to lease it and it would be more beneficial to the economic development of the airport.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury lease each of the three (3) new hangars at LeGros Memorial Airport in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty and 00/100 (\$250.00) Dollars per month for a five (5) year lease term.

The Mosquito Control Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Legislative Committee on Tuesday, November 3, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, Chairperson, Mr. David Savoy, and Mr. Robert Guidry.

Mr. Glenn Stokes, MCCI, stated that the mosquito population was average based on the amounts of mosquitoes collected in light traps this year and previous years. He also stated that the mosquito control trucks were spraying morning and night and that there had been no human or equine cases of West Nile in Acadia Parish this year. He recommends that the Police Jury do not aerial spray due to cost, lack of mosquito-borne illnesses in Acadia Parish, and the duration of effectiveness.

Discussion was held regarding the Mosquito Control truck ground spraying and aerial spraying.

The Road and Bridge Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Mosquito Control Committee on Tuesday, November 3, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. A. J. Broussard, Chairperson, Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, and Mr. David Savoy.

Ms. Georgette Dugas, resident of Forest Drive, expressed displeasure with the condition of Forest Drive. She stated that the newspaper printed that the repair of Forest Drive would take seven to ten days and instead the contractors only spent three hours repairing the road which resulted in an uneven and bumpy surface and loose gravel. She further stated that the road was now higher than their driveways. She also read a letter from neighbors Bill and Debbie Dore who were also displeased with the condition of Forest Drive.

Mr. Paul Benoit, resident of Forest Drive, also expressed displeasure with the condition of Forest Drive. He also stated that the road is one foot higher than it was prior to the repairs made.

Mr. Jude Leonards, resident of Forest Drive, also expressed displeasure with the condition of Forest Drive. He also stated that the road was washboard and would continue to get worse.

Mr. Tim Mader, Mader Engineering, stated that the initial damage to the road had taken place approximately one year ago. He sought to remind the Police Jury that the original plan was to haul limestone onto Forest Drive to temporarily make the road usable so residents could get to and from their homes. He also stated that the repairs made to Forest Drive were to be considered as Phase I. He further stated that he would be conducting an inspection of Forest Drive on Friday, November 6, 2015.

No action was taken.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the setting of a 15 MPH Speed Limit on Bearing Drive.

No discussion was held regarding the blacktopping of Aspen Road near Egan, LA.
