The Legislative Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Insurance Committee on Tuesday, November 5, 2013, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. A. J. Credeur and Mr. David Savoy. Mr. Alton Stevenson, Chairperson, was absent.

Discussion was held regarding drainage board member compensation. It was determined that compensation amounts were set by Legislative Statutes.

Travis Broussard, Attorney, addressed the Committee on behalf of Nick Stelly regarding the parish noise ordinance. He stated that he did not feel the noise ordinance pertained to Nick Stelly's welding shop because of the exception in Ordinance 924, Section L, Number 4. This exception explains that the decibel levels shall not apply to "Domestic power equipment and commercial power equipment, unless otherwise restricted herein." Mr. Broussard further stated that in an attempt to satisfy all parties regarding this noise issue Mr. Nick Stelly is opening his welding shop later in the morning and closing at the normal time which is causing a loss in revenue for Mr. Stelly, his employees, and tax dollars.

Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, stated that there was a discrepancy with Ordinance 924 regarding the definition of Residential District and that he would further review all past and present Noise Ordinances and form an opinion on how to correct the discrepancy in Ordinance 924.
