

The Legislative Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, December 3, 2013, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present were Mr. A. J. Credeur and Mr. David Savoy. Mr. Alton Stevenson, Chairperson, was absent.

Discussion was held regarding drainage issues on U. S. Hwy 90, west of Roller Canal. The Acadia Parish Planning Commission requested that the Acadia Parish Police Jury send a letter to the LA DOTD and the Sixth Ward Drainage District regarding these issues.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. A. J. Credeur and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the President to sign a letter to the LA DOTD and the Sixth Ward Drainage District regarding drainage issues on U. S. Hwy 90, west of Roller Canal.

Mr. Ray Faulk, landowner in Acadia Parish, expressed displeasure regarding the threatening manner in which pipeline companies approach landowners about obtaining land when running pipeline. He stated that there is no governing of where pipelines are run.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. A. J. Credeur and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct legal counsel to determine the legality of creating an ordinance to establish a pipeline corridor within Acadia Parish.

Mr. Charles Reiners, landowner in Acadia Parish, stated that pipeline companies cite state statutes and claim they can expropriate land in order to get landowners to sign over rights-of-way.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mrs. Julie Borill and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct legal counsel to review all documents concerning the removal of trees from property owned by Ms. Danna Premeaux.

Discussion was held regarding funding for the repair of Vie Terre Beau Road Bridge.

Juror Robert Guidry suggested using economic development funds to fund this project.

Juror A. J. Credeur concurred, stating that they should use economic development funds because the bridge is necessary to accommodate agricultural activity in the area.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mrs. Julie Borill and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury use economic development funds to fund repairs to Vie Terre Beau Road Bridge.

Mr. Steve Campbell with Fire Protection District #8 addressed the Committee and requested help with funding the purchase of a fire truck.

Mrs. Peggy Romero, Grant Coordinator, explained that Fire Protection District #8 would need to submit a board resolution requesting that the Police Jury submit an application to the State of Louisiana for FY 2013-2014 Louisiana Local Government Assistance Program's (LGAP) Funds.
