A motion was offered by Mr. Richard Faul, seconded by Mr. Chuck Broussard and carried unanimously, to add an item to the agenda to discuss, with possible action, incident with dog on Ed Thibodeaux Road.

Mrs. Laura Faul, Secretary-Treasurer, proposed that Mr. Richard Latiolais be retained for a 90 day period. She also suggested that the \$50,000.00 annual salary be divided in half between her and Mr. Latiolais and prorated for the 90 day period.

A motion was offered by Mr. Richard Faul, seconded by Mr. Chuck Broussard and carried, to retain Mr. Richard Latiolais until the regular meeting scheduled for May 10, 2016. The motion further stated that the Secretary-Treasurer's annual salary of \$50,000.00 be divided in half between Mrs. Laura Faul, Secretary-Treasurer, and Mr. Richard Latiolais and prorated for the period beginning retroactive to February 11, 2016 and ending May 10, 2016 and that benefits be included as well.

Juror Richard Faul stated that he had been contacted by Mrs. Pamela Courville regarding an incident where her neighbor's dog had acted aggressively towards her 6 year old son and that luckily her 21 year old step son had intervened before the dog attacked the child. He further stated that she had informed him that the same dog had killed her yorkie dog several months prior.

Discussion was held with Mr. Tim Benoit, Animal Control Supervisor, about what could be done in this situation. Mr. Benoit stated that he could not impound the animal because there was no attack on the child but he could pick up the dog and perform a Behavior Analyst Test to determine if the dog is viscous or aggressive. He also stated that this test could take approximately two weeks to perform.

A motion was offered by Mr. Richard Faul, seconded by Mr. Ronnie Fabacher and carried, to instruct the Animal Control Supervisor to pick up the aforementioned dog involved in incident on Ed Thibodeaux Road and perform a Behavior Analyst Test.
