

The Airport Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, February 2, 2016, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Chuck Broussard, Chairperson, Mr. Kerry Kilgore, and Mr. Danny Hebert.

Discussion was held regarding the leasing of the old Landry-Aero Hangar at LeGros Memorial Airport to Mr. Gene LeJeune at various rates per square footage.

A motion was offered by Mr. Danny Hebert, seconded by Kerry Kilgore and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury lease the old Landry-Aero Hangar at \$0.14 per square foot for a term of five (5) years with optional five (5) year extension that would include CPI adjustment.

Mr. Gene Lejeune questioned how much the rent would be monthly.

Juror Chuck Broussard stated that it would be \$504.00 per month.

Discussion was held regarding the trailer office located next to the old Landry-Aero Hangar at LeGros Memorial Airport.

Mr. Wayne Guillot stated he had purchased the trailer from Landry-Aero and would like to lease the land that the trailer is situated on in order to operate a satellite office of his business, Lake Air Service LLC.

Juror Chuck Broussard stated that the Police Jury would like to lease the land and trailer to Mr. Guillot for ten (10) years and after ten (10) years the trailer would become Police Jury Property. The land use rental would be based upon square footage and would be \$167.00 per year. He further stated that after ten (10) years the trailer would become Police Jury property and could be rented for \$150.00 per month plus the land use rent of \$167.00 per year.

A motion was offered by Mr. Danny Hebert, seconded by Kerry Kilgore and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury lease the land where the trailer is situated adjacent to the old Landry-Aero Hangar, the awning and the parking lot to Mr. Wayne Guillot in the amount of \$167.00 per year for ten (10) years with optional ten (10) year extension. The motion further stated that after ten (10) years the trailer would become Police Jury property and could be rented for \$150.00 per month plus the land use rent of \$167.00 per year.
