A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury accept the state contract bid for the purchase of a truck for the Parish Road Manager in the amount of \$34,099.82 and adjust the budget to reflect the purchase and to have GPS equipment installed on this vehicle.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the purchase of three pickup trucks to be used by the Division Managers in the amount of \$22,117.82 per truck.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the purchase of a pickup truck to be used by the Sign Department in the amount of \$22,900.82.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry, and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury accept the quote of Quality Equipment Co, Inc. for the purchase of three rear mowers in the amount of \$13,094.80 per mower.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury accept the quote of Quality Equipment Co, Inc. for the lease-purchase of three mower tractors with three boom mowers in the amount of \$116,313.49 per tractor/mower to be paid in monthly installments for 5 years.
