Mr. Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, stated that due to a clerical error the definition of a residential district amended by Ordinance #881 was not transferred over when Ordinance #924 was adopted. He stated that this should be corrected.

The Road and Bridge Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Legislative Committee on Tuesday, April 7, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. A. J. Broussard, Chairperson, Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and Mr. David Savoy.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to make the following amendments to the agenda:

1. Add an item to authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the setting of a 25 MPH speed limit in La Rue Smith Road.
2. Add an item to discuss the defacement of Parish Road Bridges.
3. Add an item to discuss damage to roads caused by wrecker services.
4. Remove item number 3.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the Parish Road Manager to receive proposals for the replacement of bridge on Pointe Noir Road.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, seconded by Mr. David Savoy and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the setting of a 25 MPH speed limit in Williams Road.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct Parish Road Engineer Karl Aucoin to contact the railroad company and obtain more information regarding the project permit application submitted by Zachry Exploration LLC for the crossing of Thevis Road.

Discussion was held regarding drainage issues and drainage pipe sizes on Highway 1112.

Juror Dale Trahan stated that he felt the angle and size of drainage pipes on Highway 1112 were incorrect and recommends that the owners be asked to enlarge drainage pipes.

Mr. Bill Oliver, LA DOTD, stated that the Police Jury would have to formally request the LA DOTD to change drainage requirements along Highway 1112 based upon justification provided by the Parish Road Engineer.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize Parish Road Engineer Karl Aucoin to evaluate drainage issues on Highway 1112.

Mr. Bill Oliver, LA DOTD, gave an update regarding State Right Sizing Projects.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury accept the low bid of Maintenance Oilfield Services, LLC in the amount of \$218,400.00 for the replacement of the Sidney Road Bridge.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the President to execute a revised Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the City of Crowley for repairs to Forest Drive.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the setting of a 25 MPH speed limit in La Rue Smith Road.
