A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mrs. Julie Borill and carried, to make the following amendments to the agenda:

1. Amend item number 13 to reflect a 25 mph speed limit on Ye Ole Country Road from Highway 97 west to the end at Riverside Road and a 35 mph speed limit on Ye Ole Country Road from Highway 97 east to the dead end.
2. Amend item number 14 to reflect a 35 mph speed limit on Kite Road from Butterfly Road to Canvasback Road.
3. Add an item to close two railroad crossings on Old Spanish Trail Road and construct a new railroad crossing with crossing gate on Nighthawk Road as 15a.

A *Procès Verbal* of the canvass of the returns of said election shall be made and a certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, who shall record the same in his office; another certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Clerk of Court and *Ex-Officio* Recorder of Mortgages in and for the Parish of Acadia, who shall record the same in the Mortgage Records of said Parish; and another copy thereof shall be retained in the archives of this Governing Authority.

SECTION 3. Promulgation of Election Results. The results of said election shall be promulgated by publication in the manner provided by law.

PROPOSITION (TAX RENEWAL)

Shall the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), continue to levy a four and twenty-five hundredths (4.25) mills tax on all the property subject to taxation (an estimated \$1,618,000 expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year) within the Parish for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2015 and ending with the year 2024, for the purpose of improving, maintaining and operating public libraries for the Parish?

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE OR DRIVE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON YE OLE COUNTRY ROAD FROM HIGHWAY 97 WEST TO END AT RIVERSIDE ROAD IN ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, AT A SPEED IN EXCESS OF **TWENTY-FIVE MILES PER HOUR** AND YE OLE COUNTRY ROAD FROM HIGHWAY 97 EAST TO DEAD END IN ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, AT A SPEED IN EXCESS OF **THIRTY-FIVE MILES PER HOUR** AND, PROVIDING FOR THE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

A motion was offered by Mrs. Julie Borill, seconded by Mr. Dale Trahan and carried, to close two railroad crossings on Old Spanish Trail Road and construct a new railroad crossing with crossing gate on Nighthawk Road.

Discussion was held regarding the sale of gradalls at Acadia Parish Road Department and the possible purchase of excavators. No action was taken.

A motion was offered by Mr. A. J. Broussard, seconded by Mr. A. J. Credeur and carried, to request that the Parish Attorney research the Lemon Law.

A motion was offered by Mr. Alton Stevenson, seconded by Mr. Dale Trahan and carried, to accept the recommendation of the Building and Grounds Committee that the Police Jury amend the Rice Arena budget to reflect the following changes and authorize the Rice Arena Board to accept low bid for new dirt pad:

1. Add a line item for Capital Improvements and add \$17,000.00 for the relocation of power lines, service to building, and addition of power pole at the Rice Arena to be performed by Cleco.
2. Add \$50,000.00 to the Capital Improvements Line Item for the construction of a new dirt pad to be used for a work out arena.
3. Add \$3,000.00 to the Ground Improvements Line Item for the construction of a drainage ditch at the Rice Arena.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to accept the recommendation of the Building and Grounds Committee that the Police Jury authorize to readvertise for the sale of two metal modular buildings at the Acadia Parish Detention Center.

Discussion was held regarding the termination of the contract with E. B. Feucht for removal of sediment at Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill. The Police Jurors expressed displeasure that because the contractor did not fulfill the contract and remove the sediment it caused the slope to slough off and questioned whether or not the Police Jury could go against the contractor's bond.
