

The Legislative Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, June 2, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. David Savoy, Chairperson, Mr. Dale Trahan, and Mr. Jimmie Pellerin.

Discussion was held regarding the development of an ordinance setting policies and procedures for junk yards in Acadia Parish.

Mr. Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, stated that licenses for junk yards are issued by the State of Louisiana based upon State laws and that any ordinance the Acadia Parish Police Jury would create would not supersede State law. He further stated that the Acadia Parish Police Jury could enact an ordinance requiring junk yards to be surrounded or enclosed by a board fence or other enclosure.

Mr. Lee Hebert, Emergency Management Director, stated that the Acadia Parish Police Jury already had an ordinance in place requiring junk yards to be surrounded by a fence.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to call for a recess to the Legislative Committee Meeting while Mr. Brad Andrus reviewed the ordinance Mr. Lee Hebert mentioned.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to reconvene the Legislative Committee Meeting.

Mr. Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, stated that there is an ordinance in place requiring junk yards to be surrounded by a fence.

No action was taken.

Discussion was held regarding the installation of a 4-way stop sign at the intersection of Sidney Richard Road and Airport Road.

Juror Robert Guidry stated that he was opposed to the installation of 4-way stop signs as a means of regulating speed on roads. He stated that if 4-way stop signs were installed along Parish roads it would become a nuisance to farmers traveling on Parish roads.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin to authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the installation of a 4-way stop sign at the intersection of Sidney Richard Road and Airport Road. Motion died for lack of a second.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, seconded by Mr. David Savoy and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the setting of a 35 MPH speed limit on Monceaux Road.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, seconded by Mr. David Savoy and carried, to add an item to the agenda to authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the setting of a 25 MPH speed limit on Bulldog Lane.

A motion was offered by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, seconded by Mr. David Savoy and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the calling of a public hearing to receive comments on the setting of a 25 MPH speed limit on Bulldog Lane.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mr. David Savoy and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize the advertisement for bids for the purchase of a compactor to be used at the Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill.

Discussion was held regarding fines for garbage non pickups.

Mr. Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, stated that the issue with fining Progressive for non pickups is determining if the resident had put the trashcan at the road at the proper time to be picked up. He suggested that the installation of cameras on the trash trucks would eliminate that issue.

Mr. Mike Dingler, representative of Progressive Waste, stated that they did not pay any fines they were billed for because there was no proof if the trashcans had been put at the road at 4 AM.

Juror A. J. Credeur suggested that the contract be amended to require that cameras be installed on both sides of the trash trucks.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mr. David Savoy and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury amend the contract with Progressive Waste to require that cameras be installed on both sides of the trash trucks.
