

The Building and Grounds Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, June 3, 2014, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Robert Guidry, Chairperson, and Mr. A. J. Broussard. Mr. Alton Stevenson was absent.

Mr. Jeff Bouillon, Chairman of the Rice Arena Board, addressed the Committee and requested that the Rice Arena Budget be amended for the following items:

1. Add a line item for Capital Improvements and add \$17,000.00 for the relocation of power lines, service to building, and addition of power pole at the Rice Arena to be performed by Cleco.
2. Add \$50,000.00 to the Capital Improvements Line Item for the construction of a new dirt pad to be used for a work out arena.
3. Add \$3,000.00 to the Ground Improvements Line Item for the construction of a drainage ditch at the Rice Arena.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mr. A .J. Broussard and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury amend the Rice Arena budget to reflect the following changes and authorize the Rice Arena Board to accept low bid for new dirt pad:

1. Add a line item for Capital Improvements and add \$17,000.00 for the relocation of power lines, service to building, and addition of power pole at the Rice Arena to be performed by Cleco.
2. Add \$50,000.00 to the Capital Improvements Line Item for the construction of a new dirt pad to be used for a work out arena.
3. Add \$3,000.00 to the Ground Improvements Line Item for the construction of a drainage ditch at the Rice Arena.

A motion was offered by Mr. A. J. Broussard, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize to readvertise for the sale of two metal modular buildings at the Acadia Parish Detention Center.

The Solid Waste Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Road and Bridge Committee on Tuesday, June 3, 2014, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. A. J. Broussard and Mrs. Julie Borill. Mr. A. J. Credeur was absent.

Mr. Brett Bayard with Mader Engineering addressed the Committee and explained that because the silt had not been removed from Phase V the water level rose too high and saturated the slope causing it to fail. The failure of the slope caused the road to slough off. Mr. Bayard suggested that we terminate contract with E. B. Feucht & Sons and leave the silt in place, flatten the slope, and relocate and reconstruct the road.

A motion was offered by Mrs. Julie Borill, seconded by Mr. A. J. Broussard and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury terminate contract with E. B. Feucht & Sons for silt removal at Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill.

A motion was offered by Mrs. Julie Borill, seconded by Mr. A. J. Broussard and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury authorize Mader Engineering to acquire proposals for road relocation at Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill.

Mr. Roland Boudreaux, Mayor of Rayne, addressed the Committee expressing displeasure with the operations of Progressive Waste. He presented photographs of oil leaks on roads in the City of Rayne presumed to be caused by the Progressive Waste trucks. He further stated that the company frequently does not collect garbage on schedule.

Mr. Joe Brown, Progressive Waste Route Supervisor and Mr. Tim Taylor, Progressive Waste Operations Manager assured the Committee these issues would be resolved.

Mr. William Nevitt, resident of Acadia Parish, stated that the oil leaks on the road were a Federal Offense and were considered a Hazardous Waste Spill.

No action was taken.

The Committee requested that representatives from Progressive Waste attend the next Solid Waste Committee Meeting.
