

Prior to the Building and Grounds Committee Meeting scheduled at 6:30 P. M. on Tuesday, July 1, 2014, the following public comments were made:

Mr. Charles King expressed concern regarding the language in the current Solid Waste Ordinance #572 is vague regarding the use of the landfill and contains no definitions. He presented proposed changes to the Solid Waste Ordinance #572 as it pertains to the definitions for residential, commercial, and manufactured waste and the procedures for accepting waste into the Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill.

Mr. Jimmy Ancelet expressed concern regarding the condition of L. Boudreaux Road following the completion of a pipeline project in the area. He stated that there are large portions of the road that are completely crushed and questioned if the road will be fixed and by whom.

Mr. Anthony Broussard questioned what the ordinance prohibiting exploding targets in Acadia Parish was for and expressed concern that adopting another ordinance would not be efficient if we do not enforce the ordinances we currently have.

Mr. A. J. Broussard read correspondence from the Mr. Roland Boudreaux, Mayor of Rayne, regarding several issues with trash pickup in the last month. Mr. Broussard also stated that he had received several calls regarding issues with trash pickup as well.

Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, Juror, also stated that he had complaints regarding trash pickup.

Ms. Georgette Dugas, resident of Acadia Parish, expressed concern regarding the large pools of oil left on the roads in Forest Park Subdivision following the pickup of trash by Progressive Waste trucks.

Ms. Donna Bertrand, employee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury, stated that she had received several calls regarding trash pickup in addition to a complain about damaged property to a home at 813 S. Chevis in Rayne, LA two weeks in a row. She questioned who the responsible party would be regarding the damages.

Mr. Dave Clabo and Mr. Timothy Taylor of Progressive Waste stated that they must be made aware of issues in order to resolve them and that the issues stated would be tended to.

A motion was offered by Mr. Alton Stevenson, seconded by Mr. A. J. Broussard and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury appoint the Parish President or his designee to the Acadiana Criminalistics Laboratory Task Force.
