

The Building and Grounds Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, August 4, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Robert Guidry, Chairperson, Mr. Alton Stevenson, and Mr. David Savoy.

A motion was offered by Mr. Alton Stevenson, seconded by Mr. David Savoy and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct the Building and Grounds Committee members, Courthouse Maintenance Supervisor, a representative of the Sheriff Office, and the Secretary-Treasurer to conduct a walkthrough of the Courthouse to determine a suitable location to house inmates during court proceedings and possible office space for the District Attorney's Office.

A motion was offered by Mr. David Savoy, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury lease office space in the Cullen Investment Building for \$800.00/month, utilities included, to house the Veteran's Affairs Office. Mr. Alton Stevenson voted no.

The Legislative Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Building and Grounds Committee on Tuesday, August 4, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. David Savoy, Chairperson, Mr. Dale Trahan, and Mr. Jimmie Pellerin.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury amend Tall Grass Ordinance #897 to include that an annual letter be sent to repeat violators of the ordinance and to have fees be increased to \$150.00 plus cost of legal fees, cost to cut grass, and postage cost.

Mr. Brad Andrus, Parish Attorney, stated that he was waiting to receive multiple opinions from the Attorney General's Office before he proposed changes to the Noise Ordinance.

Mrs. Chasity Fontenot, resident of Acadia Parish, stated that she would like the Police Jury to amend the Noise Ordinance to prohibit the use of ATVs and motorized cycles in recognized subdivisions for pleasure riding because the exhaust noise and frequency of use is a nuisance.

Juror Robert Guidry stated that he would like to amend the Noise Ordinance to prohibit the use of ATVs and motorized cycles within 300 feet of a recognized subdivision for pleasure riding.

SECRETARY

The Solid Waste Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Road and Bridge Committee on Tuesday, August 4, 2015, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. David Savoy, Chairperson, Mr. A. J. Broussard, and Mr. Robert Guidry.

Mr. Randy Pietrafeso, Al-Jon, stated that at the prior meeting they had discussed the bid tabulation totals for the Compactor to be used at the Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill and that they were suppose to have been reviewed.

Juror David Savoy stated that he had spoken to the attorney about it and that the bid must be accepted as it was submitted.

Mr. Richard Latiolais, Secretary-Treasurer, stated that Al-Jon included all of the options on the Bid Form and did not submit them separately, therefore they were considered as part of the bid. He further stated the Police Jury could decide whether or not to accept the options as part of the bid but they were not obligated by law to always accept the low bid.

Mr. Randy Pietrafeso, Al-Jon, stated that he did not list the options in the base bid amount but below it on the Bid Form and questioned why the Police Jury would pay more money for a Compactor.

Juror A. J. Credeur stated that Al-Jon's Bid met or exceeded all of specifications for the Compactor while CLM's Bid did not.

Mr. Richard Latiolais, Secretary-Treasurer, stated that the CLM's Compactor included a wheel cleaning feature that the Al-Jon equipment did not.

Mr. Robert Hebert, Solid Waste Supervisor, stated that the unique wheel cleaning feature on the CLM Bomag Compactor is much needed because the wheels clog up with mud and garbage which prevents proper compaction.

A motion was offered by Mr. A. J. Broussard, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury accept the low bid of CLM Equipment for a Compactor to be used at the Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill in the amount of \$494,916.00.

A motion was offered by Mr. A. J. Broussard, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury surplus the following equipment used by the Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill:
