

The Airport Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met at 6:30 P.M. on Tuesday, August 5, 2014, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mrs. Julie Borill, Chairperson, Mr. Jimmie Pellerin, and Mr. Dale Trahan.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to add an item to the agenda to discuss land lease with H & T Farms, LLC at the LeGros Memorial Airport.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury adopt a resolution authorizing the President to sign all Federal and State Grant Agreements for Clean and Reseal Pavement Joints Phase II.

Discussion was held regarding the land lease with H & T Farms, LLC at the LeGros Memorial Airport. It was noted that the terms of the lease were in violation because they had not begun any activity on the property outlined in the lease.

A motion was offered by Mr. Dale Trahan, seconded by Mr. Jimmie Pellerin and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct the Secretary-Treasurer to write a letter to H & T Farms, LLC informing them of the requirements of their lease and that they are presently in violation for not having begun any activity on the property outlined in the lease.

Prior to the Road and Bridge Committee the following public comment was made:

Mr. Louis Cart and Mr. Sam West, residents of Iota, stated that there were severe drainage issues on and near their property located near the gully running through Iota.

The Police Jury stated that it was a drainage board issue and they would contact local drainage boards to try to get the issue corrected.

The Road and Bridge Committee of the Acadia Parish Police Jury met following the Airport Committee on Tuesday, August 5, 2014, in the Police Jury Meeting Room. Present was Mr. Dale Trahan, Chairperson, Mrs. Julie Borill, and Mr. Robert Guidry.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mrs. Julie Borill and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury consider holding a public hearing to set a 25 MPH Speed Limit on Saul Drive.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mrs. Julie Borill and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury consider holding a public hearing to set a 35 MPH Speed Limit on Ferry Canal Road.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mrs. Julie Borill and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury consider holding a public hearing to set a 25 MPH Speed Limit on Gianfala Drive.

A motion was offered by Mr. Robert Guidry, seconded by Mrs. Julie Borill and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury consider holding a public hearing to set a 15 MPH Speed Limit on Markland Lane.

Discussion was held regarding drainage issues on Ferre Canal Road.

Mr. Wade Clement stated that Mr. Jerry Wayne Clark had closed a natural drain on his property and it was causing flooding along Ferre Canal Road and in Coon Richard Subdivision. He further stated that a lawsuit had been filed by Mr. Clark to keep parish employees and drainage board members off of his property. In his opinion this violates an earlier lawsuit against Mr. Clark ordering him to open up the ditch.

A motion was offered by Mrs. Julie Borill, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to instruct the Secretary-Treasurer to have Parish Attorney Brad Andrus review t and to contact Mr. Nicholas Bellard, former Acadia Parish Attorney.

Discussion was held regarding the reconstruction of Hains Road and the obtainment of right-of-ways for this project.

A motion was offered by Mrs. Julie Borill, seconded by Mr. Robert Guidry and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct the Parish Engineer to determine the amount of right-of-way needed for the widening and reconstruction of Hains Road and to contact landowners regarding feasibility of obtaining right-of-ways.

Discussion was held regarding the reconstruction of Sidney Richard Road Bridge.

Juror Julie Borill stated that this bridge located in her district had been closed for over five years and requested that remaining bond money be used to replace the bridge.

This item was referred to the next Regular Police Jury Meeting.

A motion was offered by Mr. Julie Borill, seconded by Mr. A. J. Credeur and carried, to add the following two items to the agenda:

1. Update on Juror A. J. Credeur's correspondence with Progressive Waste regarding compliance violations.
2. Discuss and monitor complaints regarding solid waste pickup by Progressive Waste that exceeded the twenty-four hour limit.

A motion was offered by Mrs. Julie Borill, seconded by Mr. A. J. Credeur and carried, to recommend that the Police Jury instruct the Secretary-Treasurer and Solid Waste Supervisor to develop specs and contact vendors for the purchase of two new grappler trucks to be used at the Acadia Parish Sanitary Landfill.

Juror A. J. Credeur stated that he had met with fellow Juror Dale Trahan, Mr. Robert Hebert, Mrs. Patricia Pastor and Mr. Dave Clabo regarding solid waste pickup complaints and procedures for handling these complaints. He further stated that he felt the number of complaints had decreased since he began corresponding with Mr. Clabo.

Juror Robert Guidry stated that he was still receiving multiple complaints regarding solid waste pickup.

Juror A. J. Broussard listed several instances of complaints that had been filed regarding solid waste pickup and how they had not been resolved within twenty-four hours. He further stated that paperwork indicated solid waste had been collected when, in fact, it had not been.
