**WHEREAS**, Senator Fred Mills has introduced Senate Bill No. 532 into the current session of the Louisiana Legislature, which provides for certain requirements for use of ground water from the Chicot Aquifer and which will include requirements of an environmental impact statement prior to the issuance of any permits by the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources, **and**

**WHEREAS**, the Chicot Aquifer is the sole drinking water source for 15 Parishes, multiple municipalities, 1,115,334 citizens (2010 Census), and several vital industries in Southwest Louisiana, **and**

**WHEREAS**, with encroaching saltwater intrusion experienced in multiple areas of South Louisiana, now is the time to take steps to ensure that our water resources are maintained so that our citizens, farming industry, and oil and gas industry can all continue to benefit, while keeping a potential water crisis at bay, **and**

**WHEREAS**, we cannot be mindful of our water sources tomorrow, but must be mindful and vigilant today to ensure that our water sources benefit all and are used in a fair, affordable, and equitable manner.

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Acadia Parish Police Jury in regular session duly convened on this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2012, does hereby express its support of Senate Bill No. 532, as introduced by Senator Fred Mills, which provides for certain requirements for use of ground water from the Chicot Aquifer, including the requirement of an environmental impact statement prior to the issuance of any permits.

### **ORDINANCE # 1028**

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE OR DRIVE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON FONTENOT STREET IN ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, AT A SPEED IN EXCESS OF **FIFTEEN MILES PER HOUR**, AND, PROVIDING FOR THE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

**SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED** by the Police Jury of Acadia Parish, Louisiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive a motor vehicle in excess of **fifteen miles per hour** on the following described Parish Road:

#### **Fontenot Street**

**SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that any person found guilty of operating or driving a motor vehicle in excess of **fifteen miles per hour** on the Parish road described above, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction therefore, shall be fined not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50) or be imprisoned not more than ten (10) days or both.

**ORDINANCE # 1029**

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO OPERATE OR DRIVE A MOTOR VEHICLE UPON SHELBY LANE IN ACADIA PARISH, LOUISIANA, AT A SPEED IN EXCESS OF **FIFTEEN MILES PER HOUR**, AND, PROVIDING FOR THE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

**SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED** by the Police Jury of Acadia Parish, Louisiana, that it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive a motor vehicle in excess of **fifteen miles per hour** on the following described Parish Road:
