RESOLUTION

A resolution approving the holding of an election in Fire Protection District No. 8 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana, on Tuesday, November 6, 2012, to authorize the levy of a parcel fee therein.

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 8 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of Fire Protection District No. 8 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana (the "District"), adopted a resolution on April 21, 2012, calling a special election in the District on Tuesday, November 6, 2012, to authorize the levy of a parcel fee therein; and

WHEREAS, the governing authority of the District has requested that this Police Jury, acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana, give its consent and authority for the District to hold the aforesaid election, and in the event that the election carries to levy and collect the parcel fee provided for therein; and

WHEREAS, as required by Article VI, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, it is now the desire of this Police Jury to approve the holding of said election and in the event that the election carries, to levy and collect the parcel fee provided for therein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Parish, that:

SECTION 1. In compliance with the provisions of Article VI, Section 15 of the constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and in accordance with the request of the Board of Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 8 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana, this Police Jury hereby approves the holding of an election in the District, on Tuesday, November 6, 2012, at which election there will be submitted the following proposition, to-wit:

FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT NO. 8 PROPOSITION (PARCEL FEE RENEWAL)

Summary: Authority to renew a 10 year, \$25.00 parcel fee for acquiring facilities and equipment, including paying the cost of obtaining water, for fire protection purposes and all purposes incidental thereto, and to fund the proceeds of said parcel fee into bonds to pay the costs of capital improvements.

Shall Fire Protection District No. 8 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana (the "District"), levy and collect annually for a period of ten (10) years, beginning with the year 2013, a fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) on each lot, subdivided portion of ground or individual tract upon which is located, either in whole or in part, a residential or commercial structure, regardless of the structure's being occupied or unoccupied (an estimated \$16,750 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the parcel fee for an entire year), for the purpose of acquiring, facilities and equipment, including paying the cost of obtaining water, for fire protection purposes, and all purposes incidental thereto, and shall the District be further authorized to fund the proceeds of said parcel fee into bonds to pay the costs of capital improvements, said bonds to be issued from time to time in the manner provided by law, including, but not limited to, Section 1505 of Title 40 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended?

SECTION 2. In the event the election carries, this Police Jury does hereby further consent to and authorize the District to levy and collect the parcel fee provided for therein.
