A discussion was held by Blaine Dupont, Commander at the American Legion Post 77, on upcoming fundraisers and the Veterans Outreach Clinic.

With no other nominations being made, a motion was offered by Pat Daigle and seconded Gordon Ray Morgan to accept the nomination. A roll call vote was given with all yays and Kirk Guidry being absent.

A RESOLUTION ***Appointing Joni L. Guidry*** ***as the Acadia Parish Registrar of Voters***

WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury recently received the resignation of Billie Meyers, Acadia Parish Registrar of Voters, effective September 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury is tasked with the duty of appointing a registrar of voters for Acadia Parish pursuant to Louisiana Revised Statutes § 18:55 *et. seq.*; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the law, an advertisement for the upcoming appointment for the position of registrar of voters was published as required for two separate days at least one week apart in *The Crowley Post-Signal*, the Official Journal of the Acadia Parish Police Jury and the newspaper with the highest circulation in the parish; and on the website of the Acadia Parish Police Jury; and has made other reasonable

efforts to inform the public of the position's availability; and

WHEREAS, the final date for applicants to submit applications was September 6, 2025, seven days after the last date of the ad's publication, and applicants were reviewed for eligibility and qualification; and

WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury has chosen Joni L. Guidry for the position of Acadia Parish Registrar of Voters and believes he/she possesses the requisite qualifications for the position as required by Louisiana Revised Statutes § 18:52; and

WHEREAS, this resolution shall serve as the notice of appointment of Joni L. Guidry as the Acadia Parish Registrar of Voters and a certified copy shall be transmitted to the Governor's Office, Louisiana Secretary of State, the State Board of Election Supervisors, and the Parish Board of Election Supervisors; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Acadia Parish Police Jury that Joni L. Guidry is hereby appointed to the office of Registrar of Voters for the Parish of Acadia; that the requirements of Louisiana Revised Statutes § 18:51 *et. seq.* have been satisfied in connection with this appointment; that the Governor of Louisiana is hereby requested to issue a commission to Joni L. Guidry as the appointed registrar of voters for this parish.

A discussion was held by Beau Petitjean and the other Jurors regarding whether it would be financially beneficial to engage Sisung Securities Corporation as a Municipal Advisor. Mr. Petitjean explained that Sisung Securities Corporation would research the benefits of taking out a bond to redo roads in Acadia Parish totaling 10 million dollars over a 15-year time period.

Acadia Parish Police Juror for District 4, Gordon Ray Morgan, stated that he did not feel comfortable going into debt for very few roads to be completed if it cost around 1 million dollars to redo 1 mile of road.

Walter Andrus, Acadia Parish Police Juror for District 1, suggested waiting until 2027 when the original bond is paid off before Acadia Parish discussed getting another bond.

A motion was made by Paul Ed Guidry and seconded by Walter Andrus and carried unanimously to table this discussion.

A motion was made by Gordon Ray Morgan and seconded by Pat Daigle and carried unanimously to renew the Temporary Housing Assistance Waiver Program.

Rostan Solutions, LLC, presented updates relative to all grant projects under their management. A discussion was held in regard to the Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant which is assistance for elevation for homeowners who have experienced repetitive flooding in Acadia Parish.

Acadia Parish Police Jury President, Beau Petitjean, explained that the Director for Acadia Parish Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness created a wait list that can be filled out and sent to FEMA for the Flood Mitigation Assistance Grant.

Rostan presented updates on the Waterway Debris Project, the Old VA Building Project, and the Vie Terre Beau Bridge Project.

A motion was made by Troy Lantz and seconded by Paul Ed Guidry and carried unanimously to adopt a resolution approving the final one-year extension of the Master Service Agreement with Rostan Solutions, LLC, and setting the termination of the Agreement for December 1, 2026.

*Authorizing an Amendment to the Professional Services Agreement
with Rostan Solutions, LLC*

Amendment to Professional Services Agreement - Amendment 4

WHEREAS, The Acadia Parish Police Jury and Rostan Solutions, LLC (hereinafter referred to as “Rostan”), collectively referred to as “the parties,” entered into an Agreement on December 1, 2021, for Rostan to provide certain professional services related to grant coordination and management; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement initially authorized a term of two (2) years with three (3) one-year extensions available upon mutual written consent of the parties; and the parties have previously executed and utilized two of the available one-year extensions; and

WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury agrees to execute the final one-year extension to the above referenced Agreement to extend the term of the Agreement to December 1, 2026; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Acadia Parish Police Jury has agreed, with the consent and agreement of Rostan Solutions, LLC, to amend Section 3.4 of the original Agreement to read as follows:

“SECTION 3.4 Term and Termination.

This Agreement shall be in effect for five years from its effective date and shall terminate on November 30, 2026. No further extensions may be utilized as all such extensions have been expended.

This amendment to the Agreement is made retroactive effective to the date of December 1, 2021. All other provisions of the Agreement for Professional Services shall remain in full force and effect. This amendment is hereby agreed to and incorporated into the Agreement as of the date of the signature of the latest party’s authorized agent.”
