A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, March is recognized nationally as American Red Cross Month, a time to honor those who support the humanitarian mission of the American Red Cross; and
WHEREAS, through the efforts of the Capital West Chapter, 632 families were assisted and more than 500 disasters were responded to last year, providing shelter, food, and comfort when help was needed most; and
WHEREAS, the Capital West Chapter provided over \$452,320 in immediate financial assistance and installed 1,619 free smoke alarms, making 645 households safer; and
WHEREAS, across Louisiana, the Red Cross supported nearly 2,000 military members, veterans, and their families, while 2,183 volunteers responded to emergencies and 9,700 individuals enrolled in first aid, CPR, and AED training courses.
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Beau Petitjean, by virtue of the authority vested in me as President of the Acadia Parish Police Jury, do hereby proclaim March 2026 as **Red Cross Month** in Acadia Parish, and encourage all citizens to recognize and support the lifesaving mission of the American Red Cross.

WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury entered into a contract entitled, "Agreement for Adjudicated and/or Land Banked Property Sale Services" with Archon Information Systems, L.L.C. by authority of a Resolution passed by the Police Jury on May 9, 2017; and
WHEREAS, an Agreement for Adjudicated and/or Banked Property Sale Services was executed by the President of the Police Jury on May 18, 2017 and by Bryan Barrios of Archon Information Systems, L.L.C. on May 30, 2017; and
WHEREAS, the contract provides, " The term of this Agreement shall be one year; it can be canceled at any time and shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue until the first anniversary of the Effective Date;
WHEREAS, the contract also provides for automatic renewals on the anniversary at the end of any term for which it has automatically renewed, and
WHEREAS, the contract is thus still in effect; and
WHEREAS, there exist numerous adjudicated properties owned by the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana, and it is in the best interest of the Acadia Parish Police Jury that the sale of these adjudicated properties be a priority; and
WHEREAS, the Parish of Acadia can itself provide information about these properties available for sale to parish residents, and
WHEREAS, very few adjudicated properties belonging to the Parish of Acadia have been sold through Civic Source; and
WHEREAS, the Acadia Parish Police Jury hereby determines that the services of Archon Information Systems, L.L.C. d/b/a Civic Source are no longer needed; and
WHEREAS, Section 4 of the Agreement provides for termination of said agreement at any time,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Acadia Parish Police Jury that:
The Agreement between Archon Information Systems, L.L.C. d/b/a CivicSource be terminated upon written notice to the contractor; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the Second Ward Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Second Ward Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana (the "District"), adopted a resolution on March 10, 2026, calling a special election in the District on Saturday, June 27, 2026, to authorize the continuation of a special tax therein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Police Jury of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana, acting as the governing authority of said Parish, that:

SECTION 1. In compliance with the provisions of Article VI, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana of 1974, and in accordance with the request of the Board of Commissioners of the Second Ward Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana, this Police Jury hereby approves the holding of an election in the District, on Saturday, June 27, 2026, at which election there will be submitted the following proposition, to-wit:

PROPOSITION (MILLAGE CONTINUATION)

Shall the Second Ward Gravity Drainage District No. 1 of the Parish of Acadia, State of Louisiana (the "District"), continue to levy a special tax of 10.10 mills on all the property subject to taxation within the District (an estimated \$236,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of 10 years, beginning with the year 2027 and ending with the year 2036, for the purpose of constructing, improving, maintaining and operating drainage works for the District, said millage to represent a 0.10 mills increase (due to reappraisal) over the 10 mills tax authorized to be levied through the year 2026 pursuant to an election held on March 25, 2017?

SECTION 2. In the event the election carries, this Police Jury does hereby further consent to and authorize the District to continue to levy and collect the special tax provided for therein.
